1 - Families and family issues: Well its pretty common knowledge that all families argue at some point. Some arguments are small and we get past them quickly. Others are not so small, and can hang on for years or decades at a time. The church is no different. Although we are all sinners saved by grace with a full understanding of the forgiveness that has been poured out in our own lives we still manage to find ways to argue. Some of these arguments are small, and some... not so small. The difference here is this: when we refuse to offer to others what we have accepted from Christ we in turn are denied them. Matthew 6:15 states that if we will not forgive others, than we will not be forgiven. I don't know about you but in my mind that is a pretty big deal. The premise is a simple yet powerful one. We need to make every effort to remain connected as a body of believers and representatives of Christ. Petty arguments, selfishness, and in-fighting serves no purpose other than to divide. Imagine standing before God looking back over your life and seeing all of the opportunities to add souls to the population of heaven that we have missed because we wanted to be offended, or we refused to forgive. Not so much between the two arguing parties, but those who are watching from the sidelines. As a family we never know who is observing us from a distance. The challenge for you this week is to step back and ask yourself "how am I representing my family to those I do not know are watching?" Consider both your immediate family as well as the church as an extension of your family. What can you see that needs to correction, and what can you see that you need to just let go? _____
