1 - The Power of Pauls Writings A - A common miss-understanding
On our own, we are completely incapable of living a life worthy of heaven.
"The Gospels are the central truth on which all of our beliefs rest, and the lens through which all of scripture is understood"
B - The Rest of the New Testament
C - What we all would like: A clear - step by step - outline - of what we are supposed to do, and what we are not supposed to do. What is pleasing to God, and what is not. The problem is that this is not what God has provided us.

<u>Romans 10:9</u> that if you acknowledge publicly with your mouth that Yeshua is Lord and trust in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be delivered.(CJB)

<u>1 Corinthians 6:11b</u> But you have cleansed yourselves, you have been set apart for God, you have come to be counted righteous through the power of the Lord Yeshua the Messiah and the Spirit of our God.(CJB)

2 Corinthians 5:17-20 17 Therefore, if anyone is united with the Messiah, he is a new creation—the old has passed; look, what has come is fresh and new! 18 And it is all from God, who through the Messiah has reconciled us to himself and has given us the work of that reconciliation, 19 which is that God in the Messiah was reconciling mankind to himself, not counting their sins against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. 20 Therefore we are ambassadors of the Messiah; in effect, God is making his appeal through us. What we do is appeal on behalf of the Messiah, "Be reconciled to God! (CJB)
